COVID-19 Testing

One important part of ensuring the safety and wellbeing of pupils, students, parents and our community is testing for coronavirus. We all have a duty to make sure that the right people have access to a test at the right time. There are 2 main types of test to check if you have coronavirus now:



- 1. Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) tests
- 2. 2. Lateral Flow Device (LFD) tests

If your child or anyone in your household has any Covid symptoms, however mild, they must isolate straight away and request a PCR test from www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test

If your child becomes unwell with any covid symptoms, you must book a PCR test for them and not a LFD test. Children will not be allowed to return to school until we receive the negative results from a PCR test.

LFD test should only to be used for people **without** symptoms (asymptomatic testing) because they are used to help stop the spread of the virus unknowing. Our staff continue to take part in LFD test twice a week to ensure we keep all our school community safe.
