St George's Day Facts



Today is **St. George's Day**. This day is celebrated by various Christian churches and by several countries and cities of which Saint George is the patron saint including Greece, Palestine, Georgia, Portugal and Russia.

But who was Saint George and what's the history of St. George's Day?

St George of Lydda was born in Cappadocia, an ancient district in east-central Anatolia, in the centre of present-day Turkey.

Very little is known about St. George's life, but it is thought he was a high ranking officer in the Roman army.

According to a legend, Saint George of Lydda, slayed a dragon and saved the lives of many people.

The story of Saint George and the Dragon symbolizes when good wins over evil, and is very famous.

Although St George never visited England, his reputation for virtue and holiness spread across Europe and his feast day (23rd April) was celebrated in England from the 9th century onwards.

In times gone by, people used to wear a red rose in their lapels to celebrate St. George's Day. Nowadays, people display the Saint George's cross flag outside their homes.

This weekend the hymn Jerusalem will be sung at church services where St George's day is celebrated.
