### Covid Update

This week has seen the easing of some restrictions in school. I do hope that they have made life easier for our families. We have noticed some small issues with regards to crowding and families waiting. In the morning we have taken steps to alleviate this and have shared this with Reception parents. We would also like to start the same soft start principal with Year 2 as the older children. Children in Hawthorn and Cherry class will now go straight into their classroom as they arrive at school. Cedar class will go in through the KS1 corridor. These are the doors that we use when it is raining to get the children straight in.

At the end of the day there is more crowding in the KS2 playground. Please be aware that this is unavoidable and that recommendations are that face coverings are worn in crowded places. I also ask that you spread out as much as possible. This will help keep our families safe and make it easier to dismiss the children as we can see parents and carers more clearly.

We have had another great week here at Chase Lane. Our new Reception children have made an amazing start to full-time school and are thriving in their new classrooms.

This week we had our first Parents Forum meeting for 2021-2022 and we welcomed 3 new parents to the group. This was in addition to the parents who committed prior to the pandemic. The forum is not a decision making group but a fantastic opportunity to share good news with parents and listen to the views and ideas of parents in a professional meeting. Parents carefully raised many questions which were gratefully received. Some issues raised have resulted in the school taking further actions. Thank you again to all of those who were able to give their time.


Our current PTA members have worked really hard over previous years to arrange many fun events such as:
