Help Save The Planet

Many of you may have seen on the news or heard people recently talking about COP26, but just what is it? Well COP stands for 'Conference of the Parties'. The 2021 meeting is in Glasgow and will be the 26th meeting held, which is why it's called COP26. It should have taken place last year but it was postponed due to the coronavirus pandemic.

For almost three decades, world governments have been coming together, almost every year, to make plans on how to tackle the growing climate change crisis. The meeting lasts for 2 whole weeks and is due to end on 12th November.

So what is Climate Change?

When we talk about climate change, we are talking about global changes in the Earth's average temperature. The Earth's average temperature moves up and down naturally, but it has been increasing more rapidly than it usually does. This change is impacting on the planet's environment - which is everything natural around us; rivers, trees, plants, animals... everything! Extra pollution and waste are some of the causes of climate change.

So what are some of the simple things we can all do to help save the planet?

Greener at home – think about anything you can reuse before throwing it away. Consider recycling more; give things away to friends or family.

Reduce the amount of electricity, petrol, water, plastic you use. Put notes on objects round the house to remind you e.g. 'switch me off' on light switches or 'turn me off' on your sink tap.

Save water - try not to keep the water running when brushing your teeth or doing the washing-up.

Use less Petrol - leave the car behind and walk whenever possible.

Use less plastic reuse carrier bags and where possible, try not to use plastic ones.


School Nurse Drop-In Session
