## Home Geography Project!

As many of our families live within Chingford Mount, we thought this would be a perfect opportunity for pupils to share their knowledge and understanding of their local area.

It would be lovely for as many families as possible to engage in some Geographical activities which promote their knowledge, skills and understanding of Geography.

Below are a list of activities which pupils may wish to complete:

- A tally or pie chart which represents different modes of transport within Chingford Mount.
- A poster promoting the public to walk or cycle to school.
- Fact files about famous human or physical landmarks identified in Chingford. For example, you could research the answers to the following questions: When was the Chingford Mount war memorial erected? Who visits this landmark? Has the landmark changed over time and how?
- Creating a song, with lyrics which represents your cultural heritage, based on a landmark in Chingford.
- Write a poem about Chingford using your five senses.
- Pictures of animals from a local habitat
- Create a journey stick by collecting objects from your travels around Chingford. E.g. a ticket, a receipt, food packaging.
- Research a place of worship in Chingford.
- A piece of art work which encapsulates a place in Chingford. E.g. a mosaic, sculpture, collage.

### Shrove Tuesday

Every year people celebrate Pancake Day but did you know the day is actually called Shrove Tuesday? Do you know the meaning behind this special day?

Here are some facts about Shrove Tuesday.

- Shrove Tuesday is a term used in Ireland, the United Kingdom, Canada, America and Australia for the day before Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday is the first day of the Christian season of prayer and fasting called Lent.
- The exact date of Shrove Tuesday changes from year to year, but one thing stays the same - it is always 47 days before Easter Sunday. Yes, you guessed, it's always on a Tuesday!
- On Shrove Tuesday, people traditionally cook and eat pancakes. The reason for this was to use up foods such as fat, eggs and milk before Lent.



- Pancakes have become such a popular Shrove Tuesday tradition that on this day, a whopping **52** million eggs are used in the UK alone!
- In other countries, Shrove Tuesday has different names. In Germany, for example, it's called 'Fastnacht' (meaning 'Eve of the Fast') and in Iceland it's called 'Sprengidagur' (meaning 'Bursting Day')
