# Wild Science

In Year 4 we are learning about the Amazon rainforest. This week the children enjoyed a Wild Science workshop where they had the chance to touch, hold and interact with a variety of animals from different animal groups. They continued their cross curricular learning in class.















In our science lesson the children explained which was their favourite vertebrate (animal with an internal skeleton) and using features e.g. if it lays eggs, they classified the animal into one of 5 of the vertebrate groups (mammals, birds, reptiles, fish or amphibians).


# Dentistry
