So what is Children's Mental Health Week?

Place2Be launched the first-ever Children's Mental Health Week in 2015 to shine a spotlight on the importance of children and young people's mental health.

Now in its ninth year, the purpose is to encourage more people than ever to get involved, spread the word, and raise vital funds for children's mental health.

What is Mental Health?

Mental health describes our emotional, psychological, and social well-

It affects how we think, feel, and act but also helps determine how we

handle stress, relate to others, and make choices. Sometimes we can experience mental health problems, which can massively affect our thinking, mood, and behaviour.

This year's goal is about encouraging people to connect with others in healthy, rewarding and meaningful ways. In school, the children have been thinking about the people, things and activities they

feel connected to. Having healthy connections with friends, family and other people is important to help support our wellbeing.

The MHST (Mental Health Support Team) work with our school and they may work with your child and teachers to help them understand their feelings and how to manage them.
