Ramadan

The Islamic holy month of Ramadan begins on Wednesday 22 March. Ramadan is a very important time in the Islamic calendar, and Muslims all over the world will be preparing to take part.

During the month of Ramadan, Muslims won't eat or drink between dawn and sunset. This is called fasting.

Fasting is one of the Five Pillars of Islam, which form the basis of how Muslims live their

lives. The other pillars are faith, prayer, charity and making the pilgrimage to the holy city of Mecca.

For Muslims, Ramadan is also a time for spiritual reflection, prayer, doing good deeds and spending time with family and friends.

There is a special festival to mark the end of Ramadan. This is called **Eid al-Fitr** - the Festival of the Breaking of the Fast.

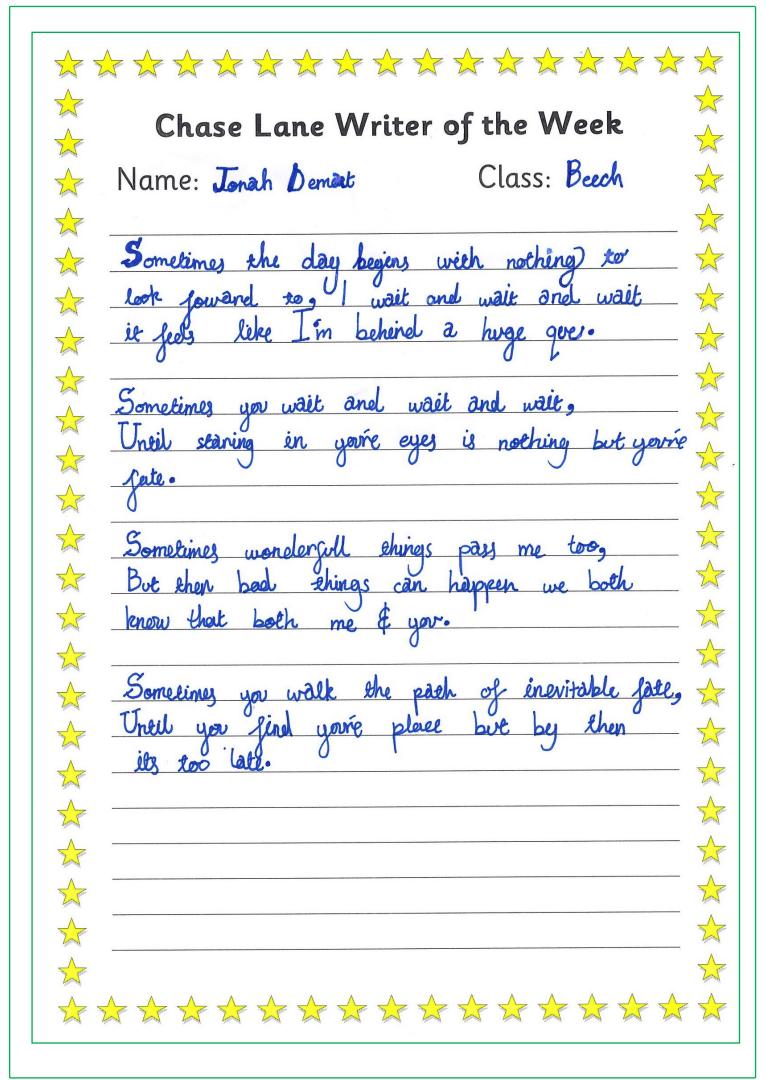

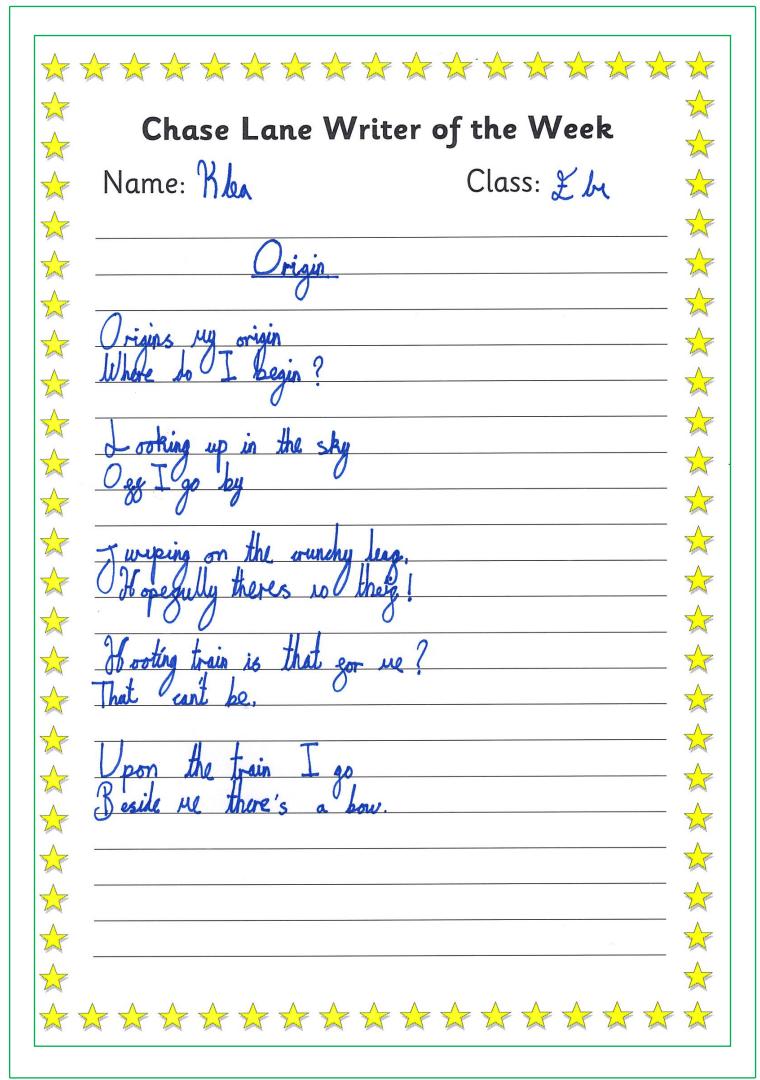

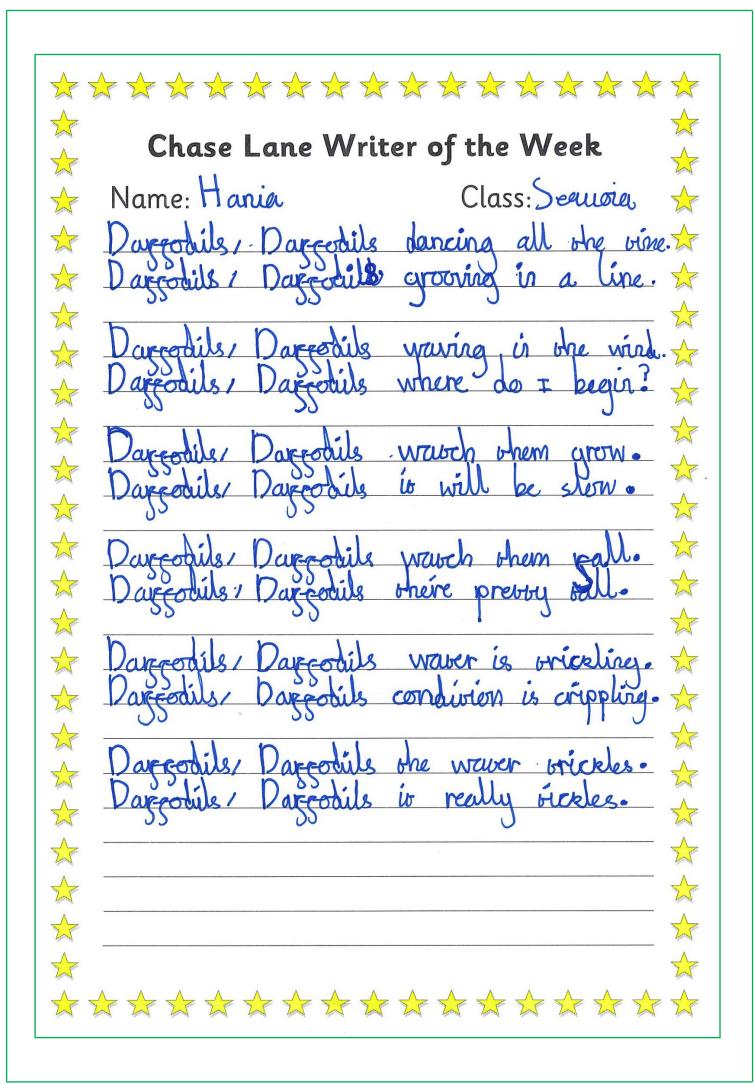
