Ramadan

On the evening of Sunday 10th March, the holy month of Ramadan began for Muslims.

So what is Ramadan?

Ramadan is a very important time in

the Islamic calendar, and Muslims all over the world take part. During the month of Ramadan, Muslims do not eat or drink between dawn and sunset. This is called fasting. For Muslims, fasting is important during Ramadan as they believe it allows them to devote themselves to their faith and come closer to Allah.

Fasting is one of the Five Pillars of Islam, which form the basis of how Muslims live their lives. The other Pillars of Islam are: faith, prayer, charity and making the pilgrimage to the holy city of Mecca.

Each day at the end of the fast, when the sun has gone down, families and friends will get together for iftar to break their fast.

For Muslims, Ramadan is also a time for spiritual reflection, prayer, doing good deeds such as giving charity and spending time with family and friends.

There is a special festival to mark the end of Ramadan. This is called Eid al-Fitr - the Festival of the Breaking of the Fast. Muslims will not only celebrate the end of fasting, but will also thank Allah for the help and strength that they were given throughout the previous

Lent

This year Lent started on 14th February and will end on 31st March, Easter Sunday. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the 40 days of Lent (not including Sundays), leading up to Easter.

So what is Lent?

Lent is a period of 40 days where (in some Christian faith), Christians remember the events leading up to and including the death of Jesus Christ, whose life and teachings are the foundation of Christianity.



RAMADAN

During Lent, many Christians decide to do a Lenten fast and give something up that they love like chocolate, sweets, coffee or even using social media. Some Christians will also take part in fasting during the day, breaking their fast each evening. They do this during Lent as a sign of sacrifice and to test their self-discipline.

Lent is also a time for doing charitable deeds, like feeding the homeless or making an effort to do nice things for their family and friends.

As you can see, many faiths have different beliefs but have very similar traditions and morals.
