"Mrs Field, I really enjoyed being with you. You take care of us, you let us enjoy eating food, you let us play and climb trees. Thank you so much!" Livana



World Art Day is coming up and we would like the whole school to be involved!








# Whole School English Project Coming Soon!

Once they were strong enough to come out, the children had the chance to hold them. The children have been really caring as they remembered to give them food and water daily. We learnt about the life cycle of a hen including new vocabulary as well as use different techniques to create pictures of the chicks.

#### What is Nowruz?

Nowruz is the Persian New Year holiday that marks the Spring Equinox. Many diverse communities celebrate this holiday around the world. Much like the spring holiday of other cultures, Nowruz is an ecofriendly holiday which champions unity, peace, and solidarity between generations, growth, and renewal.
