




Happy Passover

Monday 22nd April was the start of 'Passover' or 'Pesach'. Passover is a seven day holiday. This year it started on Monday 22nd April and it will end Tuesday 30th April.



In Judaism, Passover is one of the major festivals that are celebrated. It is a holiday of rejoicing when Jews all over the world

recall their ancestors deliverance from slavery in Egypt. Thousands of years ago the early Jews (known as the Israelites) moved to Egypt, where initially they were welcomed with open arms but very soon they became slaves of the Egyptians. They were treated very badly and made to build many of the Egyptian structures that are still standing

Here are some interesting facts about Passover:

- Jews celebrate Passover to remember how their ancestors left slavery behind them when they were led out of Egypt by Moses (as told in the book of Exodus in the Bible).
- Passover is celebrated with a series of rituals. Each ritual symbolises a different part of the story. Jews sing songs and eat special foods.
- The word Passover comes from the idea that God passed over the houses of the Israelites, who had marked their doorposts to signify that they were children of God.
- Did you know that some Christians celebrate Passover too?
- During Passover, Jews are forbidden to eat leavened food products such as bread, pasta, etc. The reason for this is that Jewish tradition states that in their haste to escape from Egypt, the Jewish people did not have enough time to wait for the bread to rise. Instead, they ate 'Matzah' which is unleavened bread.
- Jewish people eat a special Seder meal. Each item on the plate represents a different part of the Passover story:

Charoset: A sweet, brown, pebbly paste of fruits and nuts, represents the mortar used by the Jewish slaves to build the storehouses of Egypt.

A hard-boiled egg - represents spring and the circle of life.

A roasted lamb bone - lamb offered as the Passover sacrifice in biblical times. Vegetarian households use beetroots.

Bitter herbs, (often horseradish) represent the bitterness of

Parsley dipped in salt water is a reminder of the tears shed during Egyptian slavery.

Lettuce is often used in addition to the bitter herb.
