

Little Red Riding Hood – activity ideas

Talking points:

Together with your child, talk about:

- 1 interesting thing you thought about during the story (for example, it was interesting that the wolf could get dressed into Granny's clothes; I wonder why the woodsman was chopping up wood, what was it for?)
- 1 thing you liked about the story (maybe when Red Riding Hood was rescued or when she was looking at the flowers)
- 1 thing you did not like about the story (maybe when the wolf gobbled Granny up or when the wolf was talking to Red Riding Hood by the lake)
- Do you think Little Red Riding Hood should have spoken to the wolf? Why?
- What do you think the wolf should do next? Hide? Run away? Say sorry to Red Riding Hood and her Granny?
- Do you think it is okay to talk to strangers? Why?
- Can you think of another story where there is a mean wolf?

Arts & Crafts:

- Can you draw a picture of Red Riding Hood? What colour pencils will you need?
- Can you draw a picture of the wolf? Will he be angry or hungry or mean?
- Perhaps you can make your pictures into puppets and act out the story. What other characters will you need?
- You can act out the story with members of your family. Each of you can take turns to be the different characters. Don't forget to change your voice to be Granny or the mean wolf!
