Please be reminded that the children in years Reception, Year 1 and 6 will not be taught by their class teacher. Children in Year 1 and 6 will not be in their regular classroom. These measures are to ensure that it is as fair as possible and most important of all to reduce the risk as much as possible of cross contamination.

Whilst we plan this for the year groups Nursery, Reception Year 1 and 6 it must be noted that we will still continue to provide childcare for vulnerable children, those with an EHCP and those of key workers where there is not an adult in the family home who can safely provide care.

Finally, I would like to inform you that we are today saying goodbye to Miss Abdyli, who teaches Hawthorn class. Miss Abdyli has worked at our school since September 2018 and during this time she has worked enthusiastically for the benefit of her classes and the children she has taught. Please join with me in wishing Miss Abdyli all the very best for the future.
