This week's interesting facts are all about Christmas Trees.

With only 14 more sleeps until the big day, the Christmas tree is seen as a must-have decoration for many who celebrate Christmas. Many homes, shops and local attractions have decorated Christmas trees on display.



It was Prince Albert, Queen Victoria's husband, who brought the tradition to England in the 1840s.

A Christmas tree can take up to 15 years to reach typical height.

Between the 1500s and 1600s, people in Latvia and other Eastern European countries began decorating Christmas trees, and later on, the Germans adopted this tradition .

98% of all Christmas trees are grown on farms.

Artificial Christmas trees originated in Germany.

The Guinness World Records says the tallest cut Christmas tree ever was a 221-foot Douglas fir that was displayed in 1950 at a shopping centre in Seattle, USA.

Christmas trees were once hung upside down traditionally in Eastern Europe.
