COVID-19

We kindly ask that parents/carers remain vigilant and continue to comply with the rules of lockdown. These rules currently include staying at home and not mixing with households indoors or outdoors.

You should also limit contact with others outside of school and outside of your household, this will help limit the risk to our children, families

and staff from COVID-19 and we urgently need EVERYONE to follow the quidelines.

There are 2 main types of test to check if you have coronavirus now:

- 1. Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) tests this test checks for the genetic material (RNA) of the virus in the sample. You send the sample for processing at a lab.
- 2. Lateral Flow Device (LFD) this tests detect proteins called 'antigens' produced by

the virus. They give rapid results, in 30 minutes after taking the test.

If your child or anyone in your household has any Covid symptoms,

however mild, they must isolate straight away and request a PCR test from www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test

If your child becomes unwell with any symptomatic symptoms, you must book a PCR test for them and not a LFD test. Children will not be allowed to return to school until we receive the negative results a PCR test.

LFD test should only to be used for people **without** symptoms (asymptomatic testing) because they are used to help stop the spread of the virus. Our staff continue to take part in LFD test twice a week to ensure we keep all our school community safe.
