Black History Month Celebrations



Dr Anne-Marie Imafidon was born in 1990 and is a Black British computing, mathematics and language child prodigy. She is one of the youngest children to pass two GCSEs in two different subjects while in primary school. At the age of 11, she is



What about Betty Campbell?

Rachel Elizabeth Campbell - known to everyone as Betty, was born in



1934 in Cardiff's docklands area to a Jamaican father and Welsh Barbadian mother.

When Betty was a young girl her father was killed during the Second World War and her mother

struggled to earn money. Despite the family's difficulties, Betty won a scholarship to Cardiff's Lady Margaret High School for Girls. During her time there, she once told her headteacher that she wanted to be a teacher when she grew up. However, Betty's teacher told Betty that her chances of becoming a teacher were impossible.

Betty said "at first I went back to my desk and cried, but then those words made me more determined to be a teacher". Thanks to Betty's resilience and determination, she became Wales' first black headteacher. Betty was a headteacher for many years in the city of Cardiff and died aged 83 in 2017. A statue to honour

her was revealed in Cardiff last month. The statue is thought to be the first statue of a real-life woman (that is not a character from a book or story) in an outdoor public space in Wales.

Louis Lion - Being honest


Alfred Alligator - Being kind and helpful

directly with Van Cols. No orders should be sent in to the school.


Once the orders are ready, Van Cols will deliver the photographs to the school and we will give them out to the children to bring home.


Reception 2022-2023 Intake Tours
