Guinness Book of Record Day

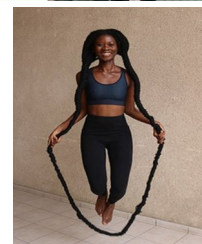

Guinness World Records (GWR) Day is an annual celebration of record-breaking where all are encouraged to show off their super skills. There were loads of records broken throughout the year and on the day. Here are just a few:

Laura Biondo is a Venezuelan football freestyler. Laura broke not one, but two records for GWR Day:

- Most sit-down football crossovers in 30 seconds (female) - 62
- Most double around the world ball control tricks in one minute (female) - 24



Laetitia Ky from Ivory Coast is a 25-year-old model, actress and artist is known for making sculptures with her locks. Laetitia set the record for most skips over a person's own hair in 30 seconds.



Professional gymnast Ashley Watson, from Leeds, broke his own record of 5m 87 for farthest backflip between two horizontal bars with the jaw-dropping distance of 6 m (19 ft 68 in)!

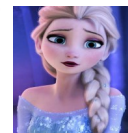

Do you ever want to become an Olympic Champion? Usain Bolt is the first ever Olympian to complete a 200 m sprint in under 20 seconds. He was the fastest 100m sprinter in his school by the age of twelve. How incredible! Have you ever wondered what it's like to be an Olympic champion? In the 2016 Rio Olympics, Bolt won the triple-triple title, which means he won gold in all three sprint races. Excellent Olympic Career

In 2004, Usain Bolt became the first Junior sprinter to run 200m in under 20 ^{seconds}. He was chosen to compete in the Olympics with the Jamaics. A recurring leg injury ruled Bolt out of winning any medals.
