*'Asalya, your meant to change your clothes before you put them in the basket!'*

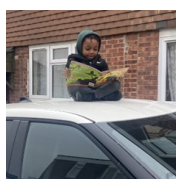


In KS2 (Years 3 - 6) our winner is **Olivia** from Willow class.

Year 6	Aspen	98.3%



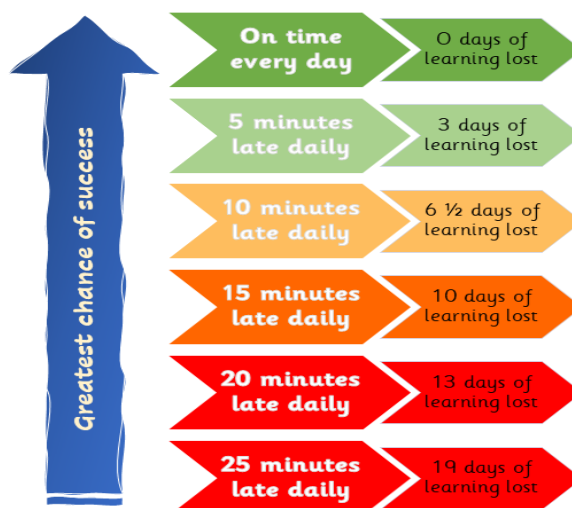
The minimum target for attendance each week as set by the Government is 96%. During the above period our overall school attendance was **96.7%**

### Punctuality Matters

The school day begins promptly at **8.45am**. Arriving promptly makes sure that your child doesn't miss work, and that disruption to the teacher and other pupils is minimised. Persistent lateness can lead to a significant loss in learning time.

Recently we have seen an increase in children arriving after 8.55am.

Persistent lateness can result in the school making a referral to the Education Welfare Officer (EWO).



### New Pupil Absence Email Address

If you need to report your child's absence due to sickness or if they have a medical appointment, please use our **new** absence email:

Alternatively you can call 020 8529 6827 before the start of the school day and select Option 1 to leave a message for the Attendance Officer.

In both instances, please provide your child's full name, class and the reason for their absence. Please do not just say that they are 'sick' - please give the details of their sickness.

If the absence is due to a medical appointment, please ensure you submit proof of the appointment for our records.

Please note that lunchtime for Reception children is 11.30am - 1.00pm, for Years 1 & 2 it is 12pm - 1.10pm and for Years 3 - 6 it is 12.15pm - 1.25pm. If your child has a medical appointment in the afternoon, we kindly ask that you please collect them either before or after their lunchbreak but **not** during because it is very difficult to find a child once their lunchtime begins as the children will be either eating their lunch or playing in the playground.

Likewise, if their appointment is in the morning please bring them in to school **before** their lunch break and not during lunch.
