International Women's Day



On the 8th March it was International Women's Day. At Chase Lane we celebrated the day by remembering those who have done or are doing incredible things to make life fairer for women. We learnt about how we can live in a way that respects the rights of all people and makes the world a fairer place.

The children spent the afternoon learning about different inspirational women that have had an important impact on society.

Nursery and Reception read some stories which challenged gender

roles and drew pictures of important women in their lives.

Year 1 learnt about the work of a local artist May Morris and created some beautiful artwork based on her designs.

Year 2 learnt about the important work of Mary Seacole during the Crimean war.

Year 3 learnt about the Suffragettes and the work of Emmeline Pankhurst. The children wrote and performed their own campaign songs!

Year 4 painted beautiful self - portraits inspired by the work of Frida Khalo.

Year 5 painted animal portraits based on the work of a British artist Debbie Boon.

Year 6 learnt about Greta Thunberg and her important work around climate change. They wrote their own inspirational climate change speeches!

At Chase Lane, we know that everyone should be treated fairly and we discussed how we can ensure that everyone has the same opportunities to achieve their dreams and goals!






