Ofsted (Office for Standards in Education) inspects schools to ensure that outcomes for children are the best they could possibly be. They check a wide range of things that schools do that all fall under the categories of 'Quality of Education', 'Leadership and Management', 'Personal Development' and 'Behaviour and attitudes'. Those of you that have Ofsted experience will know that schools are not allowed to state the final outcome of the inspection until the
