Teacher Strike

Dear Parents/Carers

Strike action Thursday 2nd March 2023.

A national strike by the NEU has been called for Thursday 2nd March 2023. The PAYURI SAVE OURSCHOOLS union is calling for better pay for teachers and greater funding for schools.



The governing body at the school have carefully assessed the likely impact of this strike action on Chase Lane Primary school. Following careful assessment and based upon the number of staff likely to be absent from work the school will be closed to most pupils on this day.

Parents/carers of most pupils will have to make alternative childcare provision for the Thursday 2nd March 2023.

Parents/carers of vulnerable pupils and families where both parents are emergency workers will receive a separate communication from the school.

Attendance 6th - 10th February 2023


Well done to the following classes for achieving the highest attendance percentage in their Year Groups ;- over 96%. The minimum target for attendance each week as set by the Government is 96%.

Breakfast Club Reminder


Parents /carers whose children attend breakfast club are politely reminded that breakfast is only served until 8.20am. Please do not bring your child after this time without having given them breakfast at home.





