Homework

Homework is set every <u>Friday</u> and is due the following <u>Wednesday</u>. For **Years 1** – **5**, reading comprehension is assigned via Seesaw.

This can be completed online or on paper and uploaded to Seesaw. To complete your homework;

- 1. Log on to Seesaw using your child's login details.
- 2. Click on Add Response the button.
- 3. There are tools down the side to help you.
- The 'T' button allows you to type your answers straight onto the text.
- If you are hand writing your homework on a separate piece of paper, you can take a picture of it using the 'camera' button and upload it.





There are also drawing tools if you need to draw lines to match answers.

4. Once you have finished, press the corner to submit your work.

Black History Month

In October we celebrate Black History Month. So who started Black History Month and why is it important?

Carter G. Woodson was a ground breaking historian in the US who recognised there was a lack of information about the achievements of black people in America.

In 1915 he set up a society to study exactly that and this is why he is known as "The father of Black history".

It wasn't until many years later in 1987, that Black History Month was adopted in the UK. Black History Month was launched in London by a man from Ghana called Akyaaba Addai-Sebo.

He came to the UK in 1984 as a refugee and, like Carter Woodson, his aim was for the local community to challenge racism and educate themselves and others about the British history of black people.

He wanted to let people know that Black people have been in Britain for a lot longer than previously thought.

This year the theme for Black History month is 'Saluting our Sisters'. It highlights the crucial role Black women have played in shaping history, inspiring change and building communities.



This week we celebrate Madam CJ Walker.



Madam C.J. Walker was the first Black female self-made millionaire.

She was the creator of a line of hair care products for black women.

Her story has now been made into a film entitled 'Self Made'.

While Rosa Parks is often given credit for being the first Black woman to refuse to give up her seat on a bus, Claudette Colvin was actually arrested nine months earlier for refusing to give up her seat for white passengers. She was aged 15 at the time.

11am to 4pm. Drop by the engagement workshops and tell them how they can improve the skate experience at Chase Lane Park.


